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BACKGROUND AND HISTORY

The GLC began as one of Chab Dai's projects over 11 years ago. The project grew on the work of the Cambodian Coalition project to build a coordinated and informed anti-trafficking movement in the region and on a global scale.

In 2021 the GLC transitioned from a Chab Dai project to a cooperative community project. The GLC community developed the new vision, mission and core values of the project with a focus on supporting, inspiring and growing one another as the anti-trafficking and modern slavery movement.


INCLUSIVE

We share resources, knowledge, and create a supportive community to exceed our individual capacity while respecting the agency of authors and originators to decide when and how to share.



EQUITY PARTNERS


